

Green Mountain Club-Worcester Section Annual Meeting Minutes Camp Headquarters-Rawson Street, Leicester, MA

Minutes as recorded by Secretary Lisa Carpenter:

The annual meeting was held at the Whitman Lodge on Saturday, November 5, 2016 at 4 p.m. The group gathered to enjoy the traditional pot luck dinner consisting of chicken and side fixings provided by a collaborative group effort. The group was joined by the GMC Executive Director, Mike Debonis. The meeting was officially opened by Section President, Pat Faron.

A motion was made and accepted to approve the 2015 Annual Meeting Minutes prepared by Lisa Carpenter, Secretary which were enclosed within the meeting handout materials.

Margos Stone, Treasurer, followed by providing his report on the fiscal year's financial activity. For the fiscal year ending September 30, 2016, the year ended with an excess of revenues over expenses in the amount of \$1,034.26 in comparison with \$833.48 for the prior fiscal year. The increase in surplus was caused primarily by the decrease increase in camp expenses. Although gifts to the Section were down approximately \$1,000 in 2016, the absence of the one-time donation in 2015 to the Winooski Bridge campaign compensated for the decrease. Total cash on hand as of September 30th was \$9,748.06.

Steve Crowe provided an update on the trail maintenance activities. There were 2 trips during the year for trail maintenance. One was a spring trip and the other was a trip to Wachusett Mountain which coincided with National Trail Day.

Pat Faron presented the membership update prepared by Sandy Snow, Membership Director who was unable to attend the meeting. She reported 127 active members, 9 new joining members, 8 dropped memberships, and 2 deceased members as the current period census data for the Worcester section.

John Oliva, Camp Committee chairperson provided an update on the significant work done on the grounds and building in addition to the annual fall cleanup that had occurred the previous Saturday. Ram Moennsad and Dick Kisten built a new structurally sophisticated fireplace. John presented Dick with a GMC service badge to recognize his devotion towards maintaining the camp.

Pat Faron represented the Nominating Committee, made a motion to appoint the following officers and committee chairs:

The meeting was adjourned at 7:15 PM following his presentation.
